

- Reading and Interpretation Be able to read texts closely for form, aesthetics, content, genre, and historical significance; be able to articulate (in class discussion or through writing) textually-grounded interpretations of poems, short stories, novels, and creative essays.
- Contribute to a writers' community by providing constructive feedback on peer writing in workshops, by attending and participating in campus creative writing readings, and by submitting writing to literary journals for publication.

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
